I really like the artwork in the book. Some were cute, some were serious, and some were edgy. It really adds some extra personality to the work. The whole tone of the book is easygoing and casual. It was easy to read and it felt like I was talking to a good friend about their experiences. You can definitely catch a glimpse of the author's personality through reading the book.

There were some grammar issues with the book. I do believe that the book may have been translated by somebody other than the writer, so that may be where those have come from.
