ARCHBISHOP DESMOND TUTU

Each year, Action Against Hunger recognizes individuals who have made major contributions in the fight against hunger. The past recipients of the Award include actor Jeff Bridges, Dr. Yvonne Grellety and President Nelson Mandela.

ARCHBISHOP DESMOND TUTU

Born in Klerksdorp, near Johannesburg, South Africa, in 1931, Archbishop Desmond Tutu initially followed in his father's footsteps and obtained teaching qualifications. However, following the introduction of Bantu education in 1958, he decided to enter the ministry. He was ordained to the priesthood in Johannesburg three years later.

Following further theological studies in London, Archbishop Tutu held several positions in teaching and theological work in South and Southern Africa. Then, in 1978, he was persuaded to leave his job as Bishop of Lesotho to become the new General Secretary of the South African Council of Churches (SACC). It was in this position, which he held until 1985, that Archbishop Tutu became a national and international figure.

The SACC is committed to fulfilling the social responsibility of the Church, and as its chairperson, Tutu led a formidable crusade for justice and racial conciliation in South Africa. His tireless work was recognized in 1984, when he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. Then, following a short stint as the Bishop of Johannesburg, Tutu was elected Archbishop of Cape Town in 1986, an office he held until his retirement in 1996.

In 1996, Archbishop Tutu was appointed by President Nelson Mandela to chair the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, the body set up to probe gross human rights violations during apartheid. Following the presentation of the Commission's report to the President in October 1998, Tutu has been visiting professor at several overseas universities, and he has also published several books, the latest of which is entitled *God has a Dream*.

TERRY GEORGE

ACADEMY AWARD NOMINEE, WRITER, DIRECTOR, AND PRODUCER

Terry George received Academy Award and British Academy of Film and Television Arts (BAFTA) nominations for his first produced screenplay, *In the Name of the Father*. His directorial debut, *Some Mother's Son*, won awards at the European Film Festival, Angers European First Film Festival, and the San Sebastian International Film Festival. Mr. George was named European Young Director of the Year in 1996. Later Mr. George adapted and directed the acclaimed HBO movie based on Neil Sheehan's Pulitzer Prize-winning Vietnam War tale, *A Bright and Shining Lie*. Most recently Mr. George received an Academy Award nomination for co-writing the screenplay for *Hotel Rwanda*, a film he also co-produced and directed. Following the film's acclaim, Mr. George founded the International Fund for Rwanda with the United Nations Foundation, a fund to support development projects in Rwanda.

ANGELIQUE KIDJO

GRAMMY AWARD NOMINEE

Angelique Kidjo has earned huge respect as a songwriter and performer. Her music is steeped in the tribal and pop rhythms of her West African heritage, but she has also crossed musical and national boundaries by blending a variety of styles, including funk, salsa, jazz, rumba, soul and makossa. She has made eight albums, four of them nominated for a grammy, the latest being *Oyaya!*, which focuses on the Caribbean connection with West Africa. Throughout her career, she has collaborated with a diverse group of international artists such as Santana and Gilberto Gil. Her duet with Dave Matthews on the song *Iwoya*, which appeared on *Black Ivory Soul*, was a critical success that helped diversify her fan base. In her lyrics, Ms. Kidjo has explored the topics of race, environment, homelessness and the need to integrate. But her primary concern is education. She has been a Goodwill Ambassador for UNICEF since 2002.

VIRGINIE SOMMET

ARTIST

Action Against Hunger has been fortunate to have artist Virginie Sommet create the Spoon Award especially for this year's gala in honor of Archbishop Desmond Tutu. An MFA graduate of the University of Paris, Ms. Sommet has shown both in Europe and the United States at such venues as Galerie 170, Broan Gallery and the Andy Warhol Factory. Fostering an integration of high art and everyday life, Ms. Sommet strives to break down the comfortable distance between the perceiver and reality. Her's is a strategy based upon and requiring empathy—the very principle that knits isolated individuals into a collective humanity and that underlies the efforts of Action Against Hunger. Ms. Sommet also designed Action Against Hunger's 2004 Humanitarian Award presented to President Nelson Mandela.
